# 2024 BIG FISH OF THE YEAR DERBY Rules

- 1. Fish have to be in season to be entered.
- 2. The fish can be caught anywhere, not in just New Jersey's waters.
- 3. The fish entered has to be verified by the boat captain or another club member or at an official weigh station. A picture of the fish is a muchpreferred way to verify an entry into the Big Fish contest done by a cell phone or a regular camera. A club member can win more than one Big Fish contest prize.
- 4. Affidavits must be received within 30 days after the fish is caught. Entries for fish caught after 12/15 of a given



#### Fishing Management Issues by John Toth

**Striped Bass** - The Atlantic States Marine Fisheries Commission (ASMFC) was seeking to implement an Emergency Action Plan to increase the spawning stock biomass (SSB) of striped bass by closing down seasons we could fish for them possibly in November and December of **2025**. The SSB of striped bass is currently at 195 million pounds and the ASMFC thinks it is not enough and wants to increase it to 247 million pounds by 2029. After much back and forth with comments from recreational anglers on webinars, the ASMFC has dropped their plans to shut down seasons we could fish for them. In 2025 the regulations we have to fish for striped bass will **remain unchanged** and be the same as we have in 2024 (28- 31 inches with Bonus Tag - Status Quo). However, this story is not over and the ASMFC will resume discussion of possibly closing seasons and other actions to limit our fishing for striped bass toward the end of 2025 and any new regulations would take effect in 2026. The closing of seasons we could fish for striped bass would certainly have a devastating effect on the recreational fishing industry.

**Black Sea Bass** – At the time I am writing this article (December 21st) our quota for catching sea bass may be reduced by 20%, even though the ASMFC by their own estimates show the stocks of sea bass has increased to approximately 215 %. This 20% reduction is up for discussion by the end of December and may or may not happen. The management or I should say the mismanagement of our fisheries often take strange turns, but I will keep you updated on the regulations that affect what we can fish for in 2025 and in 2026.

#### Baked Cod with Vegetables

#### Ingredients:

- Asparagus about 1 lb. trimmed and cut into <u>2 inch</u> sections
- 1 pint of cherry tomatoes halved
- 1 Tablespoon of olive oil
- 1-1/2 lbs. of cod fish pat dry with paper towels
- 2 Tablespoons of lemon juice
- 1 teaspoon of lemon jest
- 1/4 Cup of Parmesian cheese or more to taste
- 1/4 teaspoon of onion powder
- Salt & pepper to taste

#### Preparation:

- Toss asparagus, tomatoes and olive oil in baking dish
- Brush fish with lemon juice, sprinkle lemon zest, onion powder, Parmesan cheese and salt & pepper
- Place on top of asparagus & tomatoes
- Bake at 375 degrees for about 25-30 minutes

<u>Bottle</u> of white wine goes well with this. Baked potato also with butter/sour cream. Do potato in microwave 4-5 minutes and make sure you **punctured with a knife first!**
