Latest Updates on 2024 Regulations for Striped Bass, Fluke, Sea Bass and Porgies

I am giving you the latest information that I have as I am writing this newsletter (February 1).

Striped Bass -1 fish at 28 to 31 inches and Bonus Tags will be available - season to be determined. **Note:** This regulation of **28-31 inches** has been approved by the Atlantic States Marine Commission on January 23rd.

Fluke – I reported in our January newsletter that our quota may be reduced by 14%. Now our quota for fluke has been **reduced to 28%!** This is over 1/4th of our quota! The result will be a shorter season, most likely in the fall and may end around after the first week of September. The bag limit is to be determined and may be 3 fluke at 17.5 inches or 3 fish at 18 inches. If it is 17.5 inches, the season will be shorter than one with 18 inches. Reducing our fluke quota by 28% is based on faulty data that will lead to more fishing boats and tackle shops going out of business! The regulations for fluke are yet to be determined.

Sea Bass- the quota for sea bass has not been changed and **most likely** the regulations for sea bass will have a size limit of **12.5 inches** for all seasons.

5/17 - 6/19 - 10 fish 7/1 - 8/31 - 1 fish 10/1 - 10/31 - 10 fish 11/1 - 12/31 - 15 fish

Porgies - 10% reduction in quota – season & bag limit to be determined

I wish I had better news for you on the fishing front! I will keep you posted as I learn more about our 2024 regulations.

Record Breaking King Mackerel Caught

On August1st, Dominic Vricella and his son Joe of Medford hooked into a **67.45 lb. King Mackerel** trolling a pair of wide trackers and a pair of Clark spoons five miles from Manasquan Inlet on their way home. Their first thought that it was a tuna or a wahoo, but it wasn't until the fish was close enough to hit it with the gaff that they knew that that they had a King Mackerel. At over 67 lbs., this fish is 13 lbs. heavier than the previous record set back in 1998.

The fish was weighed at Hoffman's marina in Brielle and the necessary paperwork was turned over to the state's Fish & Wildlife. The father & son are awaiting confirmation that they are the new record holders of King Mackerel for our state. (Asbury Park Press, August 4, 2023).

A Tuna Goes for \$800,000

The most expensive piece of seafood at Tokyo's largest fish sold for nearly **\$800,000** at auction on the first day of the season.

A mammoth bluefin tuna weighing nearly **525 pounds** was purchased January 4th by a wholesale dealer (Yamayuki) who has taken home the season's priciest fish four years running.

It was the fourth priciest fish on record at the Toyosu market and the highest for a tuna since the pandemic (NY Post, January 8, 2024).

New Jersey Approves two more Offshore Wind Projects

New Jersey officials approved two new offshore wind projects on January 24th that are expected to power 1.8 million homes across the state. One of them will be placed 40 miles east of Atlantic City and the other one will be placed 50 miles east of Barnegat Light. Note: the ocean floor will really be ripped up to lay cables for those long distances.

Representative Jeff Van Drew, a critic of offshore wind, who represents voters across southern New Jersey commented, "Despite numerous lawsuits, public forums, and rallies across the state of New Jersey, Governor Murphy continues to ignore the will of the people and only cares about lining the pockets of offshore wind corporations." "We do not want our coasts to be industrialized by massive offshore wind farms."

Eye on NY: Green Waste Disaster

Within 25 years, New York will find itself trying to manage the disposal of five million or more waste solar panels every year. Yet, New York has no plans for managing it. Current methods call to export them and their toxic materials to developing countries. Recycling them would cost \$135 million a year. Nonrecoverable materials in solar panels are incinerated after recycling. (New York Post, August 9, 2023) **Note:** A big downside on solar panels that is often ignored. Also, windmill blades over 300 feet long cannot be recycled and have to be disposed by other methods.
