Caught catching out of season sea bass

Party Boat Jamaica out of Brielle was caught catching out of season sea bass – they had 819 of them! Two undercover conservation officers from the state DEP were undercover on the boat working on a tip that the captain was catching illegal fish. The undercover officers issued 53 summonses to 38 anglers keeping the bass and police were also at the dock waiting for the Jamaica to come to port. Many anglers seeing the police at the dock waiting for them ran off the boat leaving all of their gear, tackle boxes and coolers filled with fish on the boat. (I actually heard this testimony from a police officer at the hearing on determining fluke regulations). Captain Howard Bogan testified that the reefs he anchored on had loads of sea bass and that he told his anglers that they could not keep the fish. Captain Howard Bogan may receive hefty fines that are still being calculated.

New Sea Bass Regulations

There were two options for the NJ Marine Fisheries Council to consider and they are:

12.5 inches – 25 fish – May 19 – Oct. 14 & Nov. 1- Dec. 31

Fishing Management Issues by John Toth

Report on NJ Assembly Meeting on Pots Off the Reef Bill- Recreational anglers have been trying to get the Pots Off The Reef Bill passed for about six years. We have signed petitions, post cards, telephone calls to legislators and letters to no avail in getting the bill passed because it has always been stopped by an Assembly Speaker with ties to the commercial industry (Garden State Seafood) from Cape May. Current Assembly Speaker Albano from the 1st District has refused to post this bill for a vote even though it had **54** members of the Assembly last year who signed on to cosponsor it (including Assemblywoman Connie Wagner who came to one of our meetings)

The JCAA, NJ Outdoor Alliance and Reef Rescue (represented at our dinner) got word that Speaker Albano was going to have a hearing on this bill (A-2645) on March 8th at his Agricultural and Natural Resources Committee in Trenton. What was different this time is that this bill represented a **compromise solution** in that the commercial anglers would have sections of the reefs restricted for their use. The President of the Jersey Coast Anglers Association, Joe Puntesecca was ill so in his absence and as a JCAA Board member, I read a prepared two- page statement to the committee explaining our problems with this bill (restricted sections were wrong, Federal funding in jeopardy, enforce, No reference 13 reefs in Federal waters of NJ's shores).

After additional testimony, voting **FOR** this bill was **Garden State Seafood** and the **RECREATIONAL FISHING ALLIANCE (RFA)!** The RFA can be reached at (888) 564-6732.

Voting AGAINST this bill was the JCAA (my testimony) along with Marvin Aleski from the Hudson River Fisherman's Association along with other clubs and organizations.

Assemblyman Albano knew he had the votes to pass this flawed bill out of his committee or else he would not have had it heard. Assemblyman Albano wanted to post this flawed bill quickly in the Assembly so it could pass, but it was pulled from the agenda since the issue of Federal funding was not confirmed. The Senate recently passed the Senate version of the bill (S-1177) that calls for complete removal of commercial gear from the reefs. What happens now? DEP Commissioner Martin is supposed to come out with a new version of this bill and the contents of it have not been disclosed. I will keep you informed.


SWABC Items for 75th anniversary

Salt-water Registration, WHO NEEDS TO REGISTER?


Individual saltwater anglers ages 16 and older MUST register if ANY of the following criteria are met:

- Recreationally fish with a hand line or rod and line, spearfish or fish by hand
- Recreationally fish in the marine and fresh tidal waters of the State of New Jersey
- Recreationally fish in marine waters outside the State of New Jersey but land the catch in New Jersey

NOTE: Anglers with a valid registration with the National Saltwater Angler Registry or have a valid license from another exempted state are required to register (for free) with the NJ Saltwater Recreational Registry Program. Registration with NJ will exempt you from having to register with the National Saltwater Angler Registry.
