Caught catching out of season sea bass

More Trouble for the Bogan Fleet. Trouble sometimes comes not only once, but several times. The Jamica, as reported in last month's bulletin, was caught keeping illegal sea bass and the captain may still face stiff fines for filling up coolers with this fish. Now, Mr. William Howard Bogan and his daughter Sharon pleaded guilty to tax evasion charges in federal court. IRS agents went into their home and seized documents that showed them under reporting income from 2004 to 2009, and keeping another set of books. Hundreds of thousands of dollars are owed to the IRS from the Jamaica fleet. They face fines of \$250,000 and 5 years in prison. Sentencing is scheduled for October 1st. Of course, this type of business is mostly in cash and their tax returns showed them not making too much revenue. That was a red flag that caught the attention of the IRS. Greed is not good!

Fishing Management Issues – by John Toth

Pots Off The Reef Bill – We have been trying to get this bill past for almost six years and even though we muster overwhelming support for it (54 Assemblymen & Assemblywomen last year) we can't get the issue resolved to our satisfaction because the commercials block it in the NJ Assembly. This is politics at its worse and that is why politicians (especially our US Congress) are receiving such low ratings by the public in over 100 years! As it stands now, DEP Commissioner Martin wants to propose a compromise solution so that both the commercial and recreational anglers have access to the reefs. There is talk about having the commercials having access on the two reefs in NJ's waters at specific locations. Also, a new reef would be built for exclusive use by recreational anglers to compensate us for the spaces used by the commercials on the two reefs in question. This solution would not solve the problem since the commercials would retain total usage of the two reefs due to the lack of enforcement. Federal law stipulates that the reefs must be accessible to all that use them. Having specific zones set up for the commercials would violate this regulation and future federal funding to build new reefs could be jeopardized. Public pressure to finally resolve this issue is building (those postcards, petitions and letters you filled out do help) and we may see some type of action soon. More info to follow as this frustrating story unfolds.

More Fishing Management Issues by John Toth

Blackfish – There was a mistake by management officials made in the amount of blackfish that was caught by us in 2011, so an adjustment is being made in our quota for 2012 that is in our favor. While these new regulations have not been officially approved, they are expected to be accepted by fishing management. All options have a **15 inch minimum size limit**.

January 1 to January $29^{th} - 4$ Fish March 1^{st} to March 31^{st} – Closed April 1^{st} to April $30^{th} - 4$ Fish May 1^{st} to July 16^{th} – Closed July 17^{th} to November 15^{th} – 1 Fish November 16^{th} to December 31^{st} – 6 Fish

Sea Bass- Again, while not receiving final approval from our NJ Marine Fisheries Council that will meet on May 10th, the JCAA at its April 24th meeting reviewed the options available and voted for Option # 2. This option would allow sea bass to be caught from May 19th through September 3rd, September 23rd through October 14th, and from November 1st through December 31st. This option would allow 191 days of fishing and it is the best option to give anglers something to fish for when the fluke season closes on September 25th. **All options have a 12.5 inch minimum size limit with at 25-fish possession limit.**



Good Recipe for Grilling Striped Bass - By John Toth

While on a fishing trip with **Captain Frank Tenore on the Fins on Feathers** and crew, I asked Captain Frank how he cooks the striped bass he catches. He told me how and this is this is way I do it based on what Captain Frank told me. This is now the season to catch striped bass and this recipe works very well on the grill. Use fillets that are about 2 inches thick or more

- Clean the fish & place the fish on paper towels to get the water out of them so that they absorb whatever marinade or sauce that you want to cook them with it (top & bottom) to get all the water out of the fish. I only use the fillets, with **no** skin on them.
- Place the bass in a container (baking dish) so that it lays flat and marinade it with Italian salad dressing. Do not use too much salad dressing, just enough to wet the fillets. Also, turn the fish over so that the under side gets marinade on it. Marinade the fish around 5 hrs. before grilling.
- Heat up the grill before grilling the fish. Then turn off to let it cool, then spray the grill with a cooking oil.
- Heat the grill back to 400 degrees and then set the fish on the grill. After about two minutes, I wet the fish with marinade. Then, using a turner/spatula to move the fish about an inch or so. This keeps the fish does not stick/weld on the hot grill that locks in the juices. Grill one side of the fish for about 7 minutes. Then I baste some marinade on the fish and then flip the fish over and repeat the moving of the fish after two minutes (just enough marinade to keep the fish moist).
- Grill the fish for about 12 –14 minutes total. Do not overcook fish!
- Chilled white wine and a salad go very nice with the bass. ENJOY!
