The World's Most Expensive Caviar

At about \$25,000 for 2.2 pounds, Almas Caviar is the most expensive caviar in the world! This caviar comes from the albino beluga sturgeon that lives in the Caspian Sea by Iran. The albino variety of sturgeon is even scarcer because their lack of melanin is a genetic condition that only affects a few members of this species. Almas caviar is obtained from sturgeon that is 100 years old or older. Consequently, they can't be easy to find. Almas in Russian means diamond and this type of sturgeon is very appropriately named. The Persians, Romans and Greeks ate caviar not only for food, but they attributed strength, healing and medicinal properties to it (Asbury Park Press, May 15, 2015).

These fish are hooked! Salmon caught near Seattle Washington contain traces of cocaine, scientists report. Dozens of doped-up fish were also infused with small amounts of nicotine and anti-depressants, researchers discovered - though the slippery suckers were not full enough drugs to get a human high. The Fast and the Shallow (Fish Facts)

Fast fish need more oxygen than slower fish. Oxygen is more plentiful near the surface than in the lower depths. For this reason, fish like marlin and tuna spend more time swimming closer to the surface than do grouper, which live on the bottom.

Strange Porpoise Accident!

Santa Ana, Calif. - A dolphin leaped onto a boat in Southern California crashing into a woman and breaking both of her ankles. Chrissie Frickman was knocked overboard when the 350-pound landed on her legs as she boated with her husband and two children. Her husband and Orange County harbor authorities helped to release the dolphin. (NY Post, July 2, 2015).

Good Recipe for Fluke and Bottom Fish by John Toth

With the fluke sea bass season upon us, I like this recipe because it is easy to prepare and tasty at the same time. Not much fuss and mess!

Flounder Fillet in a Ginger and Scallion Sauce

2 lbs. flounder fillet (fluke, sea bass, blackfish etc.)

4 scallions chopped fine

1 tbs. (tablespoon) fresh ginger chopped or minced

2 tbs. soy sauce

2 tbs. sesame oil

3 garlic cloves chopped fine or crushed

1/4 stick of butter

sprinkle of white or black pepper to taste.

In a skillet, sauté butter and all of the above ingredients accept the fish for about 5 minutes or so.

Place fillets in baking dish and pour ingredients evenly over the fish. Bake at 350 degrees for about 15-20

minutes. (Goes good with rice and chilled white wine). Enjoy!


