Fishing Report

John Toth also belongs to a fishing club in the community where he lives in Middlesex Township and this club (Regency Fishing Club) chartered the Old Salty II that sails out of Belmar. Our club member, Fred Villanova, also joined John on this trip. John, Fred and a member of the Regency club pooled their catch together and they ended up with a 38 quart cooler and a 5 gallon bucket filled with ling. John also won the pool to make it a very memorable day! A lot of eels were caught along with the ling and also some sea bass. What a day! Just about non-stop action! Our club may charter this boat in the future.

Fluke Piccata by John Toth

This is a very tasty way to make fluke during those hot summer days and when you don't want to have the oven on in your house to make your AC work harder. You can also use sea bass or ling with this recipe.

Ingredients:

- Fluke fillets (be sure to place the fish on and above with paper towels to remove as much water as possible).
- 3 large eggs
- 3 tablespoons of Parmesan cheese (regular Kraft grated is fine)
- 3 tablespoons of butter(divided)
- 5 tablespoons of olive oil (divided)
- 2 tablespoons of capers
- 4 tablespoons of fresh parsley, chopped
- Juice of 1 lemon
- ½ cup of dry white wine
- Good dash of lemon pepper seasoning (I did not use salt since the cheese and capers have it already but salt to taste)

Directions:

- 1. Mix the eggs with parmesan cheese & 1 tablespoon of parsley
- 2. Dip the fish with the egg batter & set aside on a dish
- 3. In the frying pan over medium heat, add 4 tablespoons of olive oil & 2 tablespoons of butter to melt.
- 4. Add the fish & cook about 3 minutes or so until it is golden brown on each side.
- 5. Remove fish and transfer to a platter & keep warm (place paper towels over the fish & then place a dish towel over the paper towels to trap the heat).
- 6. In the same pan, add the wine, remaining olive oil, butter, parsley, capers, juice of the lemon, and lemon pepper seasoning.
- 7. Cook this mixture and stir for several minutes, (about 4 or 5 so to reduce it down so that it is not too watery. Then pour this sauce over the fish to

This goes good with rice (Uncle Ben's 90 seconds Ready Rice – Pilaf) is a quick way to have rice ready in time and a salad or vegetable. The remaining white wine from the bottle you have used will make it taste even better! Enjoy

Do You Want To Eat The Fish From The Pharaoh Days!

Every year, Egyptians mark the arrival of spring by eating a fish many believe has been passed down by the Pharaohs called Feseehk which in Arabic literally means "smelling the breeze." It is heavily salted and even the admirers of it acknowledge that is smells more like garbage than fish. It's an Egyptian tradition that has been around for 7,000 years and the Egyptians are used to it.

The process has changed little over the years. Mullet is caught in the Mediterranean and they are washed, but left intact, guts and all! They are then packed in salt in wooded barrels and left to sit for 45 days! After that, it is good to eat for six months! Two pounds goes for about \$13, a big sum for many Egyptians.

This fish has health issues. In 2007, 49 people were poisoned and 9 dead, 26 poisoned in 2008, with 4 dead, and more than a dozen and 2 dead in 2009 and 2010 due to improperly handling of fish with dirty hands and fingernails. Despite these problems, Egyptians will continue to eat this fish for time to come. Enjoy! (NY Times, May 7, 2013).
